



In Worship during the month of September, we will be focusing on the theme of *Welcome All*. For October 5, the mini-theme will be "Welcome Others as God Welcomes You" and our scripture passages will be from Luke 18:15-17, Genesis 18:1-10, and Genesis 1:1-2:4a.

Next Sunday, October 5, is World Communion Sunday, as well as the Sunday that we will take up the Peace and Global Witness Offering. Please be in prayerful consideration of what you can give to this program that is set up to help peacemakers around the world. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." (Matthew 5:9)

As we approach the Kirkin' service, we will look at the various influences that would eventually lead "Father" Stuart to establish FPC.

Covenants and Covenanters

The XVII Century was a period of unrest in Scotland and England. In 1603, James VI of Scotland was declared King James I of the United Kingdom of England and Scotland. One of his first acts was a new "authorized" translation of the Bible (which came to be known as the King James Bible) for use by all his subjects in an attempt to unify the kingdoms by unifying their religion. He also successfully installed a panel of bishops to oversee the Scots Kirk.

However when his son Charles I declared himself supreme head of the Church, the Scots rebelled, and in 1638, he drafted the National Covenant, signed by thousands known as Covenanters, declaring that "Christ alone is head of the Kirk." The General Assembly expelled the bishops, leading to the Bishop's Wars of 1639 and 1640, leaving the Covenanters in control of Scotland. The 1643 Solemn League and Covenant brought Scotland into the First English Civil War on the side of parliament against the king. After his defeat in May 1646, Charles I surrendered to the Scots Covenanter army. As a result of negotiations to protect the Kirk, the Covenanters supported Charles I in the Second English Civil War of 1648.

After the king's capture and execution in 1649, the Covenanter government, in order to protect the Presbyterian polity and Calvinist doctrine of the Kirk, signed a treaty declaring his son as Charles II King of Scots in 1650 in return for his promise to support the Kirk. However, Oliver Cromwell crushed the Covenanter Army and annexed Scotland to the Commonwealth disestablishing Presbyterianism. After the death of Cromwell, Charles II was restored as king; however, he reneged on his treaty and Oath of Covenant, declaring the covenants "…against the fundamental laws of the kingdom." The Covenanters saw this as a betrayal of trust.

The Covenanters lost control of the Kirk and became a persecuted minority. There were several armed uprisings, leading to a period from 1679-1688 known as "The Killing Time" where they were actively hunted down by government forces. They were forced to worship in secret "conventicles," keeping Presbyterianism alive at the risk of imprisonment or death if captured, as many were. After the "Glorious Revolution" of 1688, which deposed James II in favor of William and Mary, the Church of Scotland was re-established as a wholly Presbyterian structure and most Covenanters were readmitted ending their existence as a separate movement.
