

and confess our sin.


#### PRAYER OF CONFESSION


Merciful God,

that we may be faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.




## John Calvin

A French theologian, pastor and reformer in Geneva during the Protestant Reformation, Calvin was originally trained as a humanist lawyer. He was the principal figure in the development of the system of Christian theology later known as Calvinism, which is the basis of Presbyterianism. Calvin embraced Protestant beliefs in the late 1520s as espoused by Huldrych Zwingli, an early Swiss reformer. Writing between 1536 and 1539, Calvin's Institutes of the Christian Religion was the most widely influential work of the era. In it he taught the absolute sovereignty of God, salvation by grace through faith alone, the authority of Scripture, and the doctrine of predestination. In support of Calvin's reforms, the Council of Geneva passed ordinances providing for four orders of ministry: pastors to preach and administer sacraments, doctors to instruct believers in the faith, elders to provide discipline, and deacons to provide for the poor and needy. (Sound familiar?). Starting in 1555, Calvin sheltered exiles who fled the reign of Catholic Mary Tudor of England, including John Knox who would carry Calvin's ideas on doctrine and polity back to Scotland and establish the Church of Scotland, which in America would become the Presbyterian Church.


