



Presbyterianism In The USA

The history of American Presbyterianism is one of schism and reconciliation: someone puts forth a progressive idea, conservative members oppose it, and one side or the other forms a new denomination which may eventually rejoin the other.

In the decades following independence, many American Protestants were swept up in a revival movement, later known as the Second Great Awakening. In 1810, frontier revivalists split from the PCUSA and formed the Cumberland Presbyterian Church. By 1838, the PCUSA itself had divided into the Old School (strict conformity to the Westminster Confession) and the New School (revivalists), each of which had a General Assembly claiming to represent the PCUSA. A further split affecting both Schools occurred in 1858 along regional lines, leading to the eventual formation of the Presbyterian Church in the Confederate States of America, absorbing both Old and New School Southerners. After the war, this group became known as the Presbyterian Church in the United States (the "Southern Church") where Old School thought predominated, and under whose auspices, our own congregation formed in 1867. In 1869, the northern PCUSA Old School-New School factions reunited, as well (the "Northern Church") and became more open to liberal thought.

The PCUSA was joined by most Cumberland Presbyterians in 1906, but by 1936, the more conservative faction had left to form the Orthodox Presbyterian Church in response to the denomination's increasingly modernist viewpoint. Although an attempt to merge the PCUSA and the PCUS failed, in 1958, the PCUSA merged with the United Presbyterian Church of North America to form the United Presbyterian Church in the USA. As social pressures increased throughout the 1960's, the PCUS eventually split in 1973, with the conservatives forming the Presbyterian Church in America or PCA. This had the effect of lessening opposition to merger between the PCUS and UPCUSA denominations.

In 1983, the "Plan of Union" came to a vote, and on June 10, 1983, the reunification of the "Northern" and "Southern" churches was celebrated, with the current denomination taking the name "Presbyterian Church (USA)."
